LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

Study of the Bible and related materials promotes spiritual growth – especially if it also involves interaction with other Christian friends. The rich variety of opportunities for such studies and fellowship at Our Saviors Lutheran Church is summarized below.

Our program of learning begins with Sunday School, Vacation Bible School (VBS) and Confirmation. But, it doesn't end there. Opportunities for post-confirmation students include exercise for both minds and bodies. They vary from studies of particular scripture passages on Wednesdays to physical education on Monday and Thursday; from wide-ranging meditations to serious book studies; and from weekly gatherings to an annual breakfast with an invited speaker. And these studies are always connected with an opportunity to greet old friends, make new ones and invite visitors.

All members as well as visitors are welcome to participate in one or more of these opportunities for spiritual growth. By so doing our lives will be enriched and our congregation may experience more cohesiveness and vitality.

BOOK STUDIES: Every 2nd Monday, 9:30, Fireside Room, starting Sept. 9.

Studies are available for those interested in reading and discussing books. Typically, a study may run for the entire church year or for only one semester, either before or after Christmas – in person or on ZOOM.
